1. Introduction

Welcome to Zumaia, welcome to the Basque Country!

Zumaia belongs to all the people who live in this municipality. We are all citizens of Zumaia and together we build Zumaia every day.

We want Zumaia to be welcoming and collaborative. So, if you need to contact the Town Council, you will receive direct support and we will be ready to listen to all your requirements and suggestions. Zumaia is a diverse town with a great history. A town that doesn't forget its past, while it looks to the future. A future that all the people who live here will decide, together.

This guide that you have in front of you is a guide to get to know Zumaia and the Basque Country. It includes interesting information on a range of resources and its main purpose is to accompany people who have recently arrived in the municipality.

In Zumaia, many resources are available to the public – resources that we encourage you to use, because they are designed to improve all citizens' quality of life.

In Zumaia, there is also a wealth of sports clubs and social and cultural groups. Participating in these groups' organised activities is very positive on an individual and a community level.

In Zumaia and the Basque Country, Basque is our own local language. We want Basque to be the shared language, the language of cohesion, that brings us together. With this in mind, we'd like to encourage you to learn it.

Your experiences, cultures and languages make Zumaia a richer place. As our relationships develop, we are sure to have the chance to find out about them and share them with you.

Finally, we want to emphasise that the doors of our town and the Town Council are open to you.



2. Location

The Basque Country is a European nation with its own culture (value system, traditions, cultural expressions, sports etc.) and language (Basque), but it is open to the whole world.

It is made up of seven regions: Araba, Bizkaia, Gipuzkoa, Lapurdi, Nafarroa Behera, Nafarroa Garaia and Zuberoa. It has around 3 million inhabitants. At present, Araba, Bizkaia and Gipuzkoa make up an Autonomous Community, with the Basque Government as their governing body. In addition, Gipuzkoa has its own local authority, and the District Council acts as its governing body.

Migration has played an important role in the Basque Country, both historically and today. It is a very diverse place, and all the languages and cultures found in the Basque Country enrich it, in harmony with Basque culture.

Gipuzkoa sits in the north-east of the autonomous community and around 700,000 people live there. Its capital city is Donostia. Zumaia sits in the Urola Kosta district and borders the Bay of Biscay (Bizkaia), Aizarnazabal, Zestoa, Getaria and Deba.

3. Learn the Basque language

Basque is the local language of the Basque Country and it is one of the region's official languages. The Basque Country is the language's only homeland. When people come to Zumaia, they notice straight away that people speak Basque on the street, the signs are in Basque, and Zumaia in particular is a real stronghold of the language: nearly 80% of the population speaks Basque and it is a member of the UEMA (Commonwealth of Basque Municipalities). Nevertheless, Basque is a minority language and for many years it was not recognised in law. This, and other factors, left it in danger of extinction. For this reason, policies have been put in place over the last 40 years to promote the language, and there is a Basque Language Service at the Zumaia Town Council and many other public bodies. The main purpose of the service is to promote and normalise the Basque language, and the Town Council wants Zumaia to be a place that lives life in Basque.



Languages play a key role in culture in general, in the local character, identity, public cohesion; it is important for work, study and social life.

To integrate into our country, you don't have to give up your own language, of course. Learning Basque will help you understand the town as a whole, enjoy it and feel at home, and be part of the community. What's more, you can practise Basque and carry on learning on the street!

Learning Basque is a key part of integration and understanding our community. Basque unites us; Basque will enrich your experience. When you study Basque, you benefit and so does the community.

Opportunities to learn Basque

Zumaia Town Council offers subsidies for people taking Basque language courses. The requirements are that you must be a resident of Zumaia and your attendance of the course must be at least 80%.

If these two requirements are met, the Council will pay 75% of the course fee. If you are unemployed and you meet the requirements for the duration of the course, you will be reimbursed for 100% of the course fee. There are two windows for enrolment each year, in July and October.

4. Rights and resources

4.1. Municipal registration and general information

The register that records all the district's citizens is called the "Padrón Municipal" and joining the register is known as "empadronamiento". People of Spanish and foreign nationalities alike must register, whatever their administrative situation or age. Joining the register gives you access to several specific public rights.

If foreign nationals from outside the EU do not have a permanent residence permit, their registration is valid for 2 years. After that period, you need to renew your registration. If you do not renew it, it will expire.

It is important to keep the municipal register up to date and let the Council know if you change your address.

4.3. Social assistance

Basic Social Services

This is the access portal to the Basque Social Services System. Its main functions are to detect and meet social needs and to integrate people, families and groups into society.

In Zumaia, you have the right to access the Town Council Social Services, like any other person.

These services are for all people who reside in Zumaia (adults, children, victims of gender-based violence etc.), regardless of their legal situation (with or without a residence permit) and people who have not joined the municipal register.

Anyone can use the service to find more detailed information about any of its services or to start application processes. The main purpose of Social Services is to promote the wellbeing, quality of life and autonomy of the people.

Note: if you have difficulty communicating in Basque or Spanish, you can request interpretation in your language.

Report any situations that appear to be irregular to trade union organisations or the Work Inspectorate, including unreasonable working hours, discriminatory salaries, claiming payments, risks of accident or unwarranted dismissals.

5. Education

School is free and compulsory for girls and boys aged 6 to 16 years.

- 0-2 years Haurreskolak

Education models:

- **D** Teaching is entirely in the Basque language, except for the subject of Spanish.
- **B** is bilingual education.
- **A** Teaching takes place in Spanish and Basque is taught as a separate subject.

Children under 18

In Zumaia, there are public schools and a subsidised private school, all of which operate under model D. If there are places available, you can choose any of them for your child's education. Schools are not divided by sex.

During the school year, you can go directly to your chosen school or to the Basque Government Office for Education.
